Nokor Krov is a village near Angkor Wat, Siem Reap Province. Some people may think of Siem Reap Province as a wealthy or prosperous province because it's so famous because of the temples. But actually, outside of Siem Reap City the province is one of the poorest in Cambodia.

Mrs. Theany, founder and director of Future of Khmer Children Organization, started bringing assistance to Nokor Krov Village in 2011 before she started the FKC NGO. She saw the need and poverty so she took the initiative.

She started focusing on education, since as a child during the Khmer Rouge Regime she did not get an education herself, she wanted to do everything she can to provide an education to impoverished children in her home province. The local public school allowed her to teach the children. Soon she had 100 children attending her classes and had outgrown the classroom. Also, the school needed the classroom back.

Generous donors from Australia helped her buy land piece-by-piece and construct classrooms and more recently a library. The school immediately grew to 180, then to 300 at its peak. She and the staff of FKC have been providing after-school education ever since.

The Nokor Krov School duplicates the activities of the Siem Reap City School: English classes, computer classes, Khmer Dancing and music. Even during this Covid-19 pandemic the school continues to provide education by teachers meeting with students one-on-one and assigning lessons they can do at home. We hope to have face-to-face classes again soon.

For 2022 we want to start or complete the following:

1. Complete the library with desks, chairs, bookshelves, fans and electricity, as well as children's books.

- 2. Build a small canteen (dining area) for the children where breakfast can be served at least two times per week. Breakfast is the most important meal, but many Cambodian children go without it every day.
- 3. Start the same kind of sewing class as at the Siem Reap Campus to provide income for the mothers of children who study with us.
- 4. Continue to dig water wells and provide water filters.
